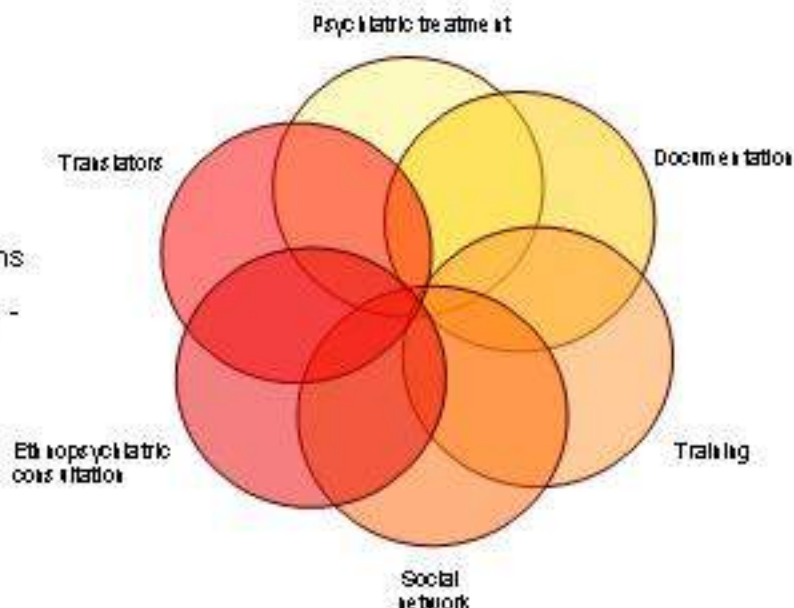


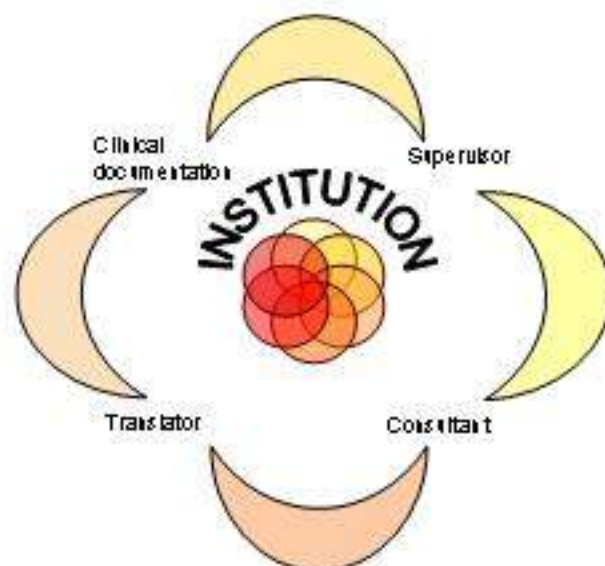
I) PSYCHIATRIC INTERACTION WITH MIGRANT PATIENTS

- Working with the individual and cultural representations of health, illness and migration
 - Behaviour and representations : institutional vs patient's own representations
 - Psychoanalytical point of view on patient - therapist relationship : analyzing transference and counter-transference
- Giving support to the family during treatment
- Networking: social, legal, somatic, child psychiatry (ASCOR, Appartenances, Refugees services, etc.)



II) PERSPECTIVES

- To offer an ethnopsychological support to medical staff during hospitalisations general and psychiatric of migrant patients
- To develop a specific ethno-therapeutic competence within the local staff



- WHO ?** A pluridisciplinary staff : Psychiatrist, psychologist, social assistant, nurse.
- TO WHOM?** To medical and paramedical staff
- WHEN?** When the medical staff believes that treatment is being influenced by elements pertaining to the patient's migration
- WHERE?** In general hospital; home intervention by the medical staff
